

Gentlemen:

At a meeting of the City Planning Commission, held March 7, 1919, and an adjourned meeting, held March 31st, the matter of the application of the Egyptian Cotton Association to lease Lots 1 - 13 of Block 10, Tract 1, Municipal Tide Lands, was carefully considered, and on account of the congested condition liable to be caused on this portion of the city tide lands by the granting of this application, the Commission has decided to recommend to your honorable body that the application be refused.

The Commission also desires to state that in case an application for cotton ware-houses should be applied for on available city water front in the neighborhood of Twenty-eighth Street, or some other equally suitable location, the Commission would be glad to consider the application.
