AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE GRADE OF THE NORTH AND SOUTH ALLEY IN BLOCK 2, ALHAMBRA PARK, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, ACCORDING TO MAP NO. 1488, ON FILE IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, BETWEEN THE NORTH LINE OF THE EAST AND WEST ALLEY IN SAID BLOCK 2, AND THE SOUTH LINE OF MONROE AVENUE.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Council of the City of San Diego, California, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the grade of the North and South Alley in Block 2, Alhambra Park, in the City of San Diego, California, according to Map No. 1488 on file in the Office of the County Recorder of San Diego County, California, between the north line of the east and west alley in said Block 2 and the south line of Monroe Avenue, be, and the same is hereby established as follows:

At the intersection of the east line of said alley with the north line of the east and west Alley in Block 2, Alhambra Park, establish the grade elevation at 377.27 feet.

At a point on the east line of said alley distant 15.71 feet northwesterly from the intersection of the east line of said alley with the north line of the east and west alley in said Block 2, establish the grade elevation at 377.40 feet; at a point on the east line of said alley distant 45.00 feet north of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 377.85 feet; at a point on the east line of said alley distant 20.00 feet north of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 378.07 feet; at a point on the east line of said alley distant 20.00 feet north of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 378.38 feet; at a point on the east line of said alley distant 20.00 feet north of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 378.79 feet; at a point on the east line of said alley distant 20.00 feet north of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 379.28 feet;

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF COMPENSATION FOR OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, PROVIDING UNIFORM COMPENSATION FOR LIKE SERVICE IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1953.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Council of The City of San Diego,
as follows:

Section 1. As a schedule of compensation for all officers and employees of The City of San Diego, including the Unclassified and Classified Service, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, there is hereby adopted and established a Table of Standard Rates of Pay, indicating the minimum and maximum and intermediate range steps for each said standard rate, all as more particularly set forth, enumerated and detailed in Exhibit "A," attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 2. For all positions in the Classified Service of The City of San Diego the rate numbers, providing uniform compensation for like service, as more particularly set forth and detailed in Exhibit "B," attached to this ordinance and made a part hereof, are hereby adopted.

Section 3. As compensation for all officers and employees of The City of San Diego in the Unclassified Service of The City of San Diego the standard rate numbers providing for compensation for such officers and employees as more particularly enumerated, set forth and detailed in Exhibit "C," attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance, are hereby adopted.

Section 4. Except as otherwise provided in the Charter of The City of San Diego, and upon the recommendation of the head of the department or appointing authority, and the approval of the Civil Service Commission, increase in salary if sufficient funds are available may be made in all positions in the Classified Service included within any of the "Standard Rates" numbered 1 to 49, inclusive, as follows: An increase in salary for such position,

unless otherwise provided, may be approximately five per cent (5%) of the existing salary rate per month prescribed for the position, class or grade in which such employee is classified, at the end of six months of continuous service at Step A in the Standard Rate for said position, and at the end of six months of continuous service at Step B in the Standard Rate for said position; and thereafter at the end of each year of continuous service in said position; provided, however, that not more than four (4) such seniority increases may be allowed in the same position; provided, further, that Skilled Trades Apprentices shall be advanced one step within the range of the Standard Rate for the class upon satisfactory completion of each six-month period of required training, subject to the recommendation of the appointing authority and the approval of the Civil Service Joint Apprenticeship Committee and the Civil Service Commission.

Notwithstanding any other provisions in this section, increases in compensation within the limits provided for by any grade may be granted at any time by the City Manager, or other appointing authority, upon the basis of efficiency and seniority record after having first received the approval of the Civil Service Commission therefor.


Section 5. In the event of the termination of employment or service of any officer or employee in the said Unclassified Service, for any cause, during the said fiscal year, the commission, body or officer having the appointing power to fill such vacancy may assign as compensation to be paid the officer or employee appointed to fill such vacancy any one of the intermediate steps of the Standard Rate Number attached to the position to be filled.

That nothing in this section contained shall be construed to authorize the increase or decrease in compensation of any person filling an office or employment in the Unclassified Service of The City of San Diego.

Section 6. For the purpose of computing sick leaves, vacations, leaves of absence, overtime, and terminal severance pay the Auditor and Comptroller is hereby authorized to utilize compilations based upon an eight-hour day and a forty-hour week.

Section 7. The members of the Classified Service, other than firemen and part-time employees, shall receive the foregoing salaries hereinabove provided as compensation in full for work performed by said members of the Classified Service during an average forty-hour week and eight-hour day throughout the fiscal year of 1953-1954, except as hereinafter provided.

 Whenever the City Manager, or other appointing authority, certifies to the Civil Service Commission that the City's interest requires an employee, in order to perform the duties assigned to him or to the position he occupies, to work at times unusual for the class of position he occupies, such as to work (1) on an established annual schedule all legal holidays throughout the fiscal year without compensatory time off, except at such time as a legal holiday coincides with a day of rest or (2) to work on an established annual schedule in which the majority of hours of work of said employee are scheduled to be performed before 8:00 A. M. or after 6:00 P. M. of any working day, or to work, on an established annual schedule, a split hour shift in which the hours of work are divided by more than two consecutive hours in a twelve-hour work period, the Civil Service Commission may authorize an increase of compensation for the employee who is required to work under the unusual conditions above described, in which case such employee shall receive one Standard Rate increase for each of the said unusual conditions which shall be certified by the appointing authority on the official payroll time sheet to the Personnel Director. Such increases in compensation shall be known as Extra Rates and shall be identified and symbolized on all official payrolls and in all records appertaining to said employees'


compensation for said fiscal year, by entering, immediately preceding the recorded increased Standard Rate for said employee, a lower case letter of the alphabet which shall identify the reason or reasons for the special increased rate of pay, as follows: "v" shall symbolize the granting of an Extra Rate in pay for the holiday work specified following (1) above; "x" shall symbolize the granting of an Extra Rate in pay for night or split hour shift work as defined in (2) above; "z" shall be used to symbolize the granting of both the foregoing Extra Rates; provided, however, that when one or all of said working conditions are commonly accepted conditions for a class of positions, the Civil Service Commission shall take such working conditions into consideration in establishing the compensation for the class.

In addition to the foregoing provisions for extra compensations the Civil Service Commission, upon request of the City Manager or other department head, may authorize the payment of additional compensation for work performed by employees in excess of the normal day and forty-hour week, or authorize the granting of compensatory time off. In this connection the Commission may authorize the payment of over-time pay up to but not in excess of one and one-half times the regular rate for the employees who are required to work overtime. The employees in the Classified Service who shall be entitled to receive overtime payment or compensatory time off, as herein provided, shall be designated by the Civil Service Commission after consultation with the department heads concerned and in accordance with definitions and procedures to be developed by the Civil Service Commission after collaboration with the appointing authorities, which said definitions and procedures after adoption shall be binding on all appointing authorities.

Section 8. In fixing and approving the Standard Rates for the officers and employees in the Classified Service of the City, as hereinabove set forth, this Council has recognized the necessity to increase certain salaries over those heretofore paid during the preceding fiscal year, and in so doing the Council has intended and does hereby intend, in fixing said rates, that where a standard rate of pay has been increased for the coming fiscal year from that heretofore paid in the past fiscal year, said officer and employee whose rate of pay has thus been increased shall be entitled to the percentage rate of increase intended, and that such new rate of pay shall be fixed so as to apply to the same step under the new Standard Rate that said employee occupied under the old Standard Rate.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirty-first day from and after its passage.



In compensation shall be known as Extra Rates and shall be identified and symbolized on all official payrolls and in all records appertaining to said employees' compensation for said fiscal year, by entering, immediately preceding the recorded increased Standard Rate for said employee, a lower case letter of the alphabet which shall identify the reason or reasons for the special increased rate of pay, as follows: "a" shall symbolize the granting of an Extra Rate in pay for the holiday work specified following (1) above; "x" shall symbolize the granting of an Extra Rate in pay for night or split hour shift work as defined in (2) above; "z" shall be used to symbolize the granting of both the foregoing Extra Rates; provided, however, that when one or all of said working conditions are commonly accepted conditions for a class of positions, the Civil Service Commission shall take such working conditions into consideration in establishing the compensation for the class.

In addition to the foregoing provisions for extra compensations the Civil Service Commission, upon request of the City Manager or other department head, may authorize the payment of additional compensation for work performed by employees in excess of the normal day and forty-hour week, or authorize the granting of compensatory time off. In this connection the Commission may authorize the payment of over-time pay up to but not in excess of one and one-half times the regular rate for the employees who are required to work overtime. The employees in the Classified Service who shall be entitled to receive over time payment or compensatory time off, as herein provided, shall be designated by the Civil Service Commission after consultation with the department heads concerned and in accordance with definitions and procedures to be developed by the Civil Service Commission after collaboration with the appointing authorities, which said definitions and procedures after adoption shall be binding on all appointing authorities.

Section 8. In fixing and approving the Standard Rates for the officers and employees in the Classified Service of the City, as hereinabove set forth, this Council has recognized the necessity to increase certain salaries over those heretofore paid during the preceding fiscal year, and in so doing the Council has intended and does hereby intend, in fixing said rates, that where a standard rate of pay has been increased for the coming fiscal year from that heretofore paid in the past fiscal year, said officer and employee whose rate of pay has thus been increased shall be entitled to the percentage rate of increase intended, and that such new rate of pay shall be fixed so as to apply to the same step under the new Standard Rate that said employee occupied under the old Standard Rate.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirty-first day from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AN EASEMENT AND RIGHT OF WAY FOR A WATER PIPELINE ACROSS CERTAIN PUEBLO LANDS OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

WHEREAS, at a municipal election held in The City of San Diego on April 27, 1937, the City was authorized to grant to the United States of America for military purposes portions of Pueblo Lot 1311 belonging to the City; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 1227 (New Series) The City of San Diego granted to the United States of America an easement and right of way for the construction, operation and maintenance of a water pipeline for a period of fifteen (15) years from and after September 24, 1937, which said easement and right of way the United States now desires to continue for an additional period of fifteen (15) years; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED By the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. (4) That the grantee will relocate the water pipeline at its own expense to conform to any plans for the future development of this area at a time when such development begins.

Section 3. There is hereby created in the City Treasury for the fiscal year 1953-1954 a revolving fund, which shall be known as the "Stores Account and Stock Fund." The moneys placed in said fund shall be used exclusively for the purposes outlined and authorized by Section 35 of the Charter. All moneys

remaining in any fund of the City heretofore appropriated for the uses and purposes as authorized by said Section 35 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1953, and aggregating the sum of \$801,040.03, are hereby transferred to the said "Stores Account and Stock Fund," and are hereby appropriated for the uses and purposes so authorized by said Section 35 of the Charter. All materials, supplies and equipment heretofore purchased for the use of any department of the City which have not been used by or are not immediately needed by said department, shall be forthwith transferred to the custody and control of the Purchasing Agent, and by him placed in such store rooms and warehouses as have heretofore been made available for his use. No transfer of the possession of such materials, supplies and equipment shall be made except in conformity with the provisions of said Section 35 of the Charter. All materials, supplies and equipment hereafter purchased for the use of the City, and not immediately needed by any department, shall also be placed in said storerooms and warehouses under the control of the Purchasing Agent, and disposed of by him only as authorized by said Section 35.

Section 4. That the sum of \$90,000.00, heretofore appropriated for the use of the City in the fiscal year 1952-1953, for the purposes of a Central Garage and Machine Shop Working Capital and Revolving Fund, is hereby transferred and placed into said fund for the fiscal year 1953-1954, and said funds, together with such funds as have been accumulated on the Auditor & Comptroller's records for equipment replacement purposes and incidental purposes, are hereby appropriated for said fiscal year 1953-1954 for said uses and purposes.

Section 5. All moneys heretofore appropriated for the use of the City in previous fiscal years for the purposes of a Print Shop Revolving Fund remaining on hand at the close of the fiscal year 1952-1953, are hereby transferred and placed into the following created fund for the fiscal year 1953-1954, in

the following amount:

Print Shop Revolving Fund in the amount of \$2,000.00

The moneys so placed in said fund are hereby appropriated for said fiscal year 1953-1954 for said uses and purposes. With the approval of the City Manager the City Auditor and Comptroller may, during the coming fiscal year, transfer all or any part of the above-named revolving fund to the credit of the Stores Account and Stock Fund.

Unexpended moneys heretofore received in connection with the Camp Callan and Balboa Park Trust Funds remaining on hand at the close of the fiscal year 1952-1953 are hereby transferred to and placed in said Camp Callan and Balboa Park Trust Funds, and appropriated for the uses and purposes heretofore authorized in connection with said trust funds.

Section 6. Any moneys deposited to the credit of the Water Department for the installation of new water services that are in excess of the estimated receipts of \$200,000.00 from said installations shall by Auditor's transfer be credited to the appropriation of the Water Department for the purpose of paying costs of said installations.

Any moneys deposited to the credit of the Water Department for the installation of new water main extensions that are in excess of the estimated receipts of \$100,000.00 from said installations shall by Auditor's transfer be credited to the appropriation of the Water Department for the purpose of paying costs of said installations.

Any moneys deposited to the credit of the Water Department for miscellaneous services rendered that are in excess of the estimated receipts of \$83,000.00 from said services shall by Auditor's transfer be credited to the appropriation of the Water Department for the purpose of paying the costs of said services.

Any moneys deposited to the credit of the General Fund for the installation of new sewer laterals and extensions that are

in excess of the estimated receipts of \$169,000 from said installations shall by Auditor's transfer be credited to the appropriation of the Department of Public Works, Division of Sewers.

Section 7. All moneys received from motor vehicle license fees shall be deposited to the credit of Motor Vehicle License Fee Account.

Section 8. All moneys received from license fees for control of alcoholic beverages shall be deposited to the credit of Alcoholic Beverage Control License Fee Account.

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated out of moneys deposited to the credit of Motor Vehicle License Fee Account and Alcoholic Beverage Control License Fee Account such amount or amounts as may be legally paid for law enforcement and the regulation and control and fire protection of highway traffic.

Section 10. Of the net proceeds received from the sale of cemetery lots fifty per cent (50%) thereof shall be deposited with the City Treasurer, to be placed in the Cemetery Perpetuity Fund.

Section 11. The Auditor and Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to set aside out of the General Fund the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of paying any unpaid obligations of prior fiscal years.

Section 12. The amount of salaries and wages as fixed and determined by the Council of said City in Ordinance No. 5623 (New Series) of the ordinances of The City of San Diego, adopted May 28, 1953, be, and the same is hereby approved.

Section 13. All moneys paid into the Treasury during said fiscal year commencing July 1, 1953, either by way of taxes or revenues collected by said City from other sources, unappropriated by this ordinance, or which are limited by trust or other restrictions, shall remain in the General Fund, or such special funds as may be restricted by gifts, grants or donations until appropriated by the Council of said City. The

item known as the "Unappropriated Balance" shall be included within the moneys so designated as the General Fund of said City.

Section 14. The total amount of money required to operate the City for said fiscal year, including the amount the City will derive from revenues other than taxes, the amount the City will derive from special taxes for the purpose of bond fund requirements of the Charter, and the amount to be raised by a general levy on all real and personal property in said City, are hereby summarized, itemized and set forth as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 31.0110 and 31.0347 THEREOF, and BY ADDING THERETO SECTION 31.0347.1, WHICH SECTIONS CONCERN THE REGULATION OF THE BUSINESS OF RENTING AUTOMOBILES AND MOTORCYCLES WITHOUT DRIVER.

follows:

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as Section 1. That Section 31.0110 of the San Diego Municipal

Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 31.0110 LICENSE TAXES - DEFINITIONS

The following words and phrases whenever used in this Chapter shall be construed as defined in this section, unless from the context a different meaning is intended or unless a different meaning is specifically defined and more particularly directed to the use of such words or phrases:

(a) "ARCADE." The word "Arcade" shall mean a general inclosure in which is conducted a business of operating or exhibiting any phonograph, graphophone, talking machine, kinetoscope, biograph, projectoscope, or any other instrument or machine of like character, or exhibiting, showing or letting the use of any microscope, lung-tester, muscle-tester, galvanic battery, weighing machine, fortune telling machine, or machine of like character.

(b) "AUTO WRECKER." The words "Auto Wrecker" shall mean any person engaged in the purchasing of motor vehicles or used motor vehicle parts, or used motor vehicle motors, for the purpose of wrecking and salvaging of parts, metals, tires and accessories, for resale; and any person who has dismantled three (3) or more vehicles for the above purpose, during any one calendar year, shall be classed as an auto wrecker.

(c) "CIRCUS." The word "Circus" shall mean an exhibition or entertainment at which feats of horsemanship,

acrobatic feats, and trained or wild animals are exhibited or displayed in the City of San Diego, for which exhibition or entertainment an admission fee is charged, and which exhibition or entertainment is conducted, managed or carried on by a person, firm, or corporation having no regularly established place of business in the City of San Diego for the exhibition thereof.

(d) "DANCING ACADEMY." The words "Dancing Academy" shall mean a regularly established place of business or entertainment where instructions in dancing or dancing lessons are given or taught and a charge or fee for such instruction or lessons is made or paid or received.

(e) "DANCE HALL." The words "Dance Hall" shall mean any place where the business of holding or conducting public dances is regularly carried on, provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed or construed to require the holder of a license to conduct the business of a public dance hall, to procure any additional license to conduct a dancing academy in the event that such dancing academy is conducted in the same location and under the same management as said public dance hall.

(f) "EMPLOYMENT BUREAU." The words "Employment Bureau" shall mean the business of securing employment for any person or persons for a fee or compensation of any kind, or furnishing information regarding situations or employment for a fee or compensation.

(g) "ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS", "PROFESSION", "OCCUPATION", "OPERATION", "PRACTICE". The words "Engaged in the business", "profession", "occupation", "operation", or "practice", shall include owning, conducting, operating, managing or carrying on; provided however, that this definition shall not be so interpreted as to require more than one license,

tax or fee to be obtained or paid for any one business enterprise.

(h) "FIRE OR WRECK SALE." The words "Fire or Wreck Sale," shall mean any sale of merchandise salvaged from any fire, wreck or other calamity occurring in the City of San Diego, and which sale is conducted by the owner of said salvaged merchandise at the time of fire, wreck or other calamity.

(i) "ITINERANT SHOW." The words "Itinerant Show" shall mean every temporary or transient show or theatrical performance, such as is usually given in theatres, and which said show or theatrical performance is conducted in any structure or tent hired, leased or erected in the City of San Diego for such purpose.

(j) "JUNK COLLECTOR." The words "Junk Collector" shall mean any person, firm or corporation having no fixed place of business in the City of San Diego, engaged in or carrying on the business of collecting, buying or selling any old rags, sacks, bottles, cans, papers, metals or other articles of junk.

(k) "JUNK DEALER." The words "Junk Dealer" shall mean any person, firm or corporation having a fixed place of business in the City of San Diego, engaging in or carrying on the business of buying, selling or exporting any old rags, sacks, bottles, cans, papers, metals or other articles of junk.

(l) "PAWN BROKER." The words "Pawn Broker" shall mean every person conducting, managing or carrying on the business of loaning money, either for himself or for any other person, firm or corporation, upon any personal property, personal security, or purchasing personal property and reselling or agreeing to resell such articles to the vendor or other assignee at prices previously agreed upon.

(m) "PEDDLER." The word "Peddler" shall mean every person not having a regularly established place of business in the City of San Diego and who travels from place to place or has a stand upon any public street, alley or other public place, doorway of any room or building, unenclosed or vacant lot or parcel of land, who sells or offers for sale any goods, wares or merchandise in his possession.

(n) "PERSON." The word "Person" shall mean all domestic and foreign corporations, associations, syndicates, joint stock companies, partnerships of every kind, clubs, Massachusetts business or common law trusts, societies and individuals engaged in any business as defined herein in the City of San Diego.

(o) "SALE OR SELL." The words "Sale or Sell" shall be deemed to include and refer to: the making of any transfer of title, in any manner or by any means whatsoever, to tangible personal property for a price, and to the serving, supplying or furnishing, for a price, of any tangible personal property fabricated or made at the special order of consumers, who do or who do not furnish directly or indirectly the specifications therefor. A transaction whereby the possession of property is transferred but the seller retains the title as security for the payment of the price shall likewise be deemed a sale. The foregoing definitions shall not be deemed to exclude any transaction which is or which, in effect, results in a sale within the contemplation of law.

(p) "SELLING GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE." The phrase "Selling Goods, Wares and Merchandise" shall, in addition to any other meaning established at law, be deemed to extend to and include in its application persons who engage in the business of fabricating, serving or supplying, for a price, tangible personal property furnished, produced or made at the special order of purchasers or consumers, or for purchaser

or consumers who do or who do not furnish, directly or indirectly, the specifications therefor.

(q) "TATTOOING." The word "Tattooing" shall mean the act or process of marking or coloring the skin of any person by the insertion of pigment under or in the skin or by the production of scars.

(r) "USED CAR DEALER." The words "Used Car Dealer" shall mean any person, firm or corporation engaged in, conducting, managing, or carrying on the business of buying, selling, or offering for sale, consigning to be sold or otherwise dealing in used motor vehicles (except bicycles), as the term "motor vehicle" is defined in the Vehicle Code of the State of California.

(s) "CABARET." The word "Cabaret" shall mean any place where alcoholic beverages and/or soft drinks are dispensed and entertainment is provided by paid entertainers, and/or entertainment is permitted to be furnished by volunteer or itinerant entertainers.

Section 2. That Section 31.0347 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 31.0347 LICENSE TAX - LETTING VEHICLE FOR HIRE
WITHOUT DRIVER

Every person engaged in the business of letting the use of any automobile or motorcycle without any driver for the same, shall pay a license tax computed at the rates hereinafter established. Licenses issued hereunder shall be semi-annual.

(a) The rate of tax for each of the following types of vehicles shall be the amount thereafter set forth and the total fee shall be based upon the total number of vehicles leased or rented or available for lease or rental.

1. For each motorcycle or automobile designed for the carrying of not more than ~~three~~ passengers, \$20.00 per year.

2. For each automobile designed for the carrying of not more than six passengers, \$30.00 per year.

3. For each automobile designed for the carrying of more than six passengers, \$40.00 per year.

(b) In lieu of the above rates, the rate for each vehicle regardless of capacity, the actual term of any single hiring of which is not less than 90 days, shall be \$6.00 per year.

Section 3. That a new section be added to Chapter III of the San Diego Municipal Code, to be numbered and titled and to read in words and figures as follows, to-wit:



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 31.0110 AND 31.0347 THEREOF AND BY ADDING THEREON SECTION 31.0347.1, WHICH SECTION CON- TAINS THE REGULATION OF THE BUSINESS OF RENTING AUTOMOBILES AND MOTOR- CYCLES WITHOUT DRIVER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY the Council of The City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. That Section 31.0110 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 31.0110. LICENSE TAXES—DEFINITIONS.

The following words and phrases whenever used in this Chapter shall be construed as defined in this section, unless from the context a different meaning is intended or unless a different meaning is specifically defined and more particularly directed to the use of such words or phrases:

(a) "ARCADE." The word "Arcade" shall mean a general inclosure in which is conducted a business of operating or exhibiting any phonograph, graphophone, talking machine, kinetoscope, biograph, projectoscope, or any other instrument or machine of like character, or exhibiting, showing or letting the use of any microscope, lung-tester, muscle-tester, galvanic battery, weighing machine, fortune telling machine, or machine of like character.

(b) "AUTO WRECKER." The word "Auto Wrecker" shall mean any person who is used

motor vehicle for the purpose of wrecking and salvaging of parts, metals, tires and accessories, for resale; and any person who has dismantled three (3) or more vehicles for the above purpose, during any one calendar year, shall be classed as an auto wrecker.

(c) "CIRCUS." The word "Circus" shall mean an exhibition or entertainment at which feats of horsemanship, acrobatic feats, and trained or wild animals are exhibited or displayed in the City of San Diego, for which exhibition or entertainment an admission fee is charged, and which exhibition or entertainment is conducted, managed or carried on by a person, firm, or corporation having no regularly established place of business in the City of San Diego for the exhibition thereof.

(d) "DANCING ACADEMY." The words "Dancing Academy" shall mean a regularly established place of business or entertainment where instructions in dancing or dancing lessons are given or taught and a charge or fee for such instruction or lessons is made or paid or received.

(e) "DANCE HALL." The words "Dance Hall" shall mean any place where the business of holding or conducting public dances is regularly carried on, provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed or construed to require the holder of a license to conduct the business of a public dance hall, to procure any additional license to conduct a dancing academy in the event that such dancing academy is conducted in the same location and under the same management as said public dance hall.

(f) "EMPLOYMENT BUREAU." The words "Employment Bureau" shall mean the business of securing employment for any person or persons for a fee or compensation of any kind, or furnishing information regarding situations or employment for a fee or compensation.

(g) "ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS." "PROFESSION." "OCCUPATION." "OPERATION." "PRACTICE." The words "Engaged in the business," "profession," "occupation," "operation" or "practice" shall include owning, conducting, operating, managing or carrying on, provided however, that this definition shall not be so interpreted as to require more than one license, tax or fee to be obtained or paid for any one business enterprise.

(h) "FIRE OR WRECK SALE." The words "Fire or Wreck Sale" shall mean any sale of merchandise salvaged from any fire, wreck or other calamity occurring in the City of San Diego, and which sale is conducted by the owner of said salvaged merchandise at the time of fire, wreck or other calamity.

(h) "FIRE OR WRECK SALE." The words "Fire or Wreck Sale," shall mean any sale of merchandise salvaged from any fire, wreck or other calamity occurring in the City of San Diego, and which sale is conducted by the owner of said salvaged merchandise at the time of fire, wreck or other calamity.

(i) "ITINERANT SHOW." The words "Itinerant Show" shall mean every temporary or transient show or theatrical performance, such as is usually given in theatres, and which said show or theatrical performance is conducted in any structure or tent hired, leased or erected in the City of San Diego for such purpose.

(j) "JUNK COLLECTOR." The words "Junk Collector" shall mean any person, firm or corporation having as fixed place of business in the City of San Diego, engaged in or carrying on the business of collecting, buying or selling any old rags, sacks, bottles, cans, papers, metals or other articles of junk.

(k) "JUNK DEALER." The words "Junk Dealer" shall mean any person, firm or corporation having a fixed place of business in the City of San Diego, engaged in or carrying on the business of buying, selling or exporting any old rags, sacks, bottles, cans, papers, metals or other articles of junk.

(l) "PAWNBROKER." The words "Pawn Broker" shall mean every person conducting, managing or carrying on the business of loaning money, either for himself or for any person, firm or corporation, upon any personal property, personal security, or purchasing personal property and reselling or agreeing to resell such articles to the vendor or other assignee at prices previously agreed upon.

(m) "PEDDLER." The word "Peddler" shall mean every person not having a regularly established place of business in the City of San Diego and who travels from place to place or has a stand upon any public street, alley or other public place, doorway of any room or building, unenclosed or vacant lot or parcel of land, who calls or offers for sale any goods, wares or merchandise in his possession.

(n) "PERSON." (o) "BAIL OR SELL." The words "Bail or Sell" shall be deemed to include and refer to: the making of any transfer of title, in any manner or by any means whatsoever, to tangible personal property for a price, and to the serving, supplying or furnishing, for a price, of any tangible personal property fabricated or made at the special order of consumers, who do or who do not furnish directly or indirectly the specifications therefor. A transaction whereby the possession of property is transferred but the seller retains the title as security for the payment of the price shall likewise be deemed a sale. The foregoing definitions shall not be deemed to exclude any transaction which is or which, in effect, results in a sale within the contemplation of law.

(p) "SELLING GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE." The words "Selling Goods, Wares and Merchandise" shall, in addition to any other meaning established at law, be deemed to extend to and include in its application persons who engage in the business of fabricating, serving or supplying, for a price, tangible personal property fabricated, produced or made at the special order of purchasers or consumers, or for purchasers or consumers who do or who do not furnish, directly or indirectly, the specifications therefor.

(q) "TATTOOING." The word "Tattooing" shall mean the act or process of marking or coloring the skin of any person by the insertion of pigment under or in the skin or by the production of scars.

(r) "USED CAR DEALER." (d) Every service connection made upon receipt of an application as provided above shall be subject to the following conditions:

1. The applicant shall pay the stipulated rates at the time and in the manner provided in this Code;
2. The Department may change rates and temporarily discontinue the service at any time without notice to the consumer;
3. The Department and The City of San Diego shall not be liable for any damage by water or otherwise resulting from defective plumbing, broken or faulty services or water mains, or resulting from any condition of the water itself, or any substance that may be mixed with or be in the water as delivered to any consumer.

Section 2. That Section 67.23 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 67.23 REGULATION OF WATER SYSTEM - CONSUMER'S






