



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE GRADE OF THE ALLEY IN BLOCK 65, MORENA, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, ACCORDING TO MAP NO. 809 ON FILE IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, BETWEEN THE NORTHERLY LINE OF MILTON STREET AND THE SOUTHERLY LINE OF LISTER STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Council of the City of San Diego, California, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the grade of the Alley in Block 65, Morena, in the City of San Diego, California, according to Map No. 809 on file in the Office of the County Recorder of San Diego County, California, between the northerly line of Milton Street and the southerly line of Lister Street, be, and the same is hereby established as follows:

At the intersection of the easterly line of said alley with the northerly line of Milton Street, establish the grade elevation at 47.50 feet.

AN ORDINANCE INCORPORATING KENSINGTON PARK IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, INTO R-2, R-4, RC AND C ZONES, AS DEFINED BY SECTIONS 101.0406, 101.0408, 101.0409 AND 101.0411 RESPECTIVELY OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS pursuant to the terms of section 101.0203 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the City Planning Commission fixed and determined a time and place for a public hearing upon a proposed zoning of Kensington Park in The City of San Diego, California, as indicated on a certain zone map on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 480656; and

WHEREAS, after due notice duly and regularly given, hearings were duly held and all persons interested were given an opportunity to appear and be heard before said Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission by a vote of 6 to 0 has filed a recommendation with the Council of said City as contained in Document No. 480656, dated November 23, 1953, recommending that Kensington Park in The City of San Diego be incorporated into R-2 zone, R-4 zone, RC zone and C zone, as such zones are described in sections 101.0406, 101.0408, 101.0409 and 101.0411 respectively of the San Diego Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, said Council is of the

opinion that the best interests of the people of The City of San Diego will be subserved by adopting the recommendation; NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That all that territory situated in The City of San Diego, California, within the boundaries of the district designated "R-2" on that certain zone map filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City under Document No. 480656 be, and the same is hereby incorporated into R-2 zone as said zone is described and defined by section 101.0406 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

Section 2. That all that territory situated in The City of San Diego, California, within the boundaries of the district designated "R-4" on that certain zone map filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City under Document No. 480656 be, and the same is hereby incorporated into R-4 zone as said zone is described and defined by section 101.0408 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

Section 3. That all that territory situated in The City of San Diego, California, within the boundaries of the district designated "RC" on that certain zone map filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City under Document No. 480656 be, and the same is hereby incorporated into RC zone as said zone is described and defined by section 101.0409 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

Section 4. That all that territory situated in The City of San Diego, California, within the boundaries of the district designated "C" on that certain zone map filed in the office of the City Clerk of said City under Document No. 480656 be, and the same is hereby incorporated into C zone as said zone is described and defined by section 101.0411 of the San Diego Municipal Code.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirty-first day from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE GRADE OF LA JOLLA HERMOSA AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, BETWEEN THE NORTHEASTERLY PROLONGATION OF THE SOUTHEASTERLY LINE OF LOT 7, BLOCK 18, LA JOLLA HERMOSA, ACCORDING TO MAP NO. 1810 ON FILE IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY RECORDER OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, AND THE EASTERLY PROLONGATION OF THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY LINE OF SAID LA JOLLA HERMOSA.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Council of the City of San Diego, California, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the grade of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue, in the City of San Diego, California, between the northeasterly prolongation of the southeasterly line of Lot 7, Block 18, La Jolla Hermosa, according to Map No. 1810 on file in the Office of the County Recorder of San Diego County, California, and the easterly prolongation of the northerly boundary line of said La Jolla Hermosa, be, and the same is hereby established as follows:

At the intersection of the southeasterly line of said Lot 7, with the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue, establish the grade elevation at 82.39 feet.

At a point on the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 36.30 feet northwesterly of the last described point, establish the grade elevation at 82.52 feet; at a point on the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 20.00 feet northwesterly of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 82.60 feet.

At a point on the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 20.00 feet southeasterly of the intersection of the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the southeasterly line of Via Del Norte, establish the grade elevation at 84.18 feet.

At the intersection of the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue with the southeasterly line of Via Del Norte, establish the grade elevation at 84.74 feet.

At a point on the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 12.22 feet northwesterly of the last described point, establish the

grade elevation at 84.68 feet; at a point on the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 16.78 feet northwesterly of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 84.77 feet.

At the intersection of the southwesterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the easterly prolongation of the northerly boundary line of said La Jolla Hermosa, establish the grade elevation at 85.45 feet.

At the intersection of the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the northeasterly prolongation of the southeasterly line of said Lot 7, establish the grade elevation at 83.18 feet.

At a point on the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 36.30 feet northwesterly of the last described point, establish the grade elevation at 83.28 feet; at a point on the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 20.00 feet northwesterly of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 83.40 feet.

At a point on the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 20.00 feet southeasterly of the intersection of the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the southeasterly line of Via Del Norte, establish the grade elevation at 85.04 feet.

At the intersection of the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the southeasterly line of Via Del Norte, establish the grade elevation at 85.12 feet.

At the intersection of the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the northwesterly line of Via Del Norte, establish the grade elevation at 85.57 feet.

At a point on the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 5.78 feet northwesterly of the last described point, establish the grade elevation at 85.57 feet; at a point on the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue distant 23.22 feet northwesterly of the last named point, establish the grade elevation at 85.68 feet.

At the intersection of the northeasterly line of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue and the easterly prolongation of the northerly boundary line of said La Jolla Hermosa, establish the grade elevation at 86.22 feet.

SECTION 2. And the grade of La Jolla Hermosa Avenue between the points hereinbefore mentioned, shall have a uniform ascent and descent; all of said grade elevations to be established are in relation to the datum line of levels as fixed by Section 62.01 and Section 62.02 of the San Diego Municipal Code of said City.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirty-first day from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING THERETO NEW SECTIONS TO BE KNOWN AND NUMBERED SECTIONS 33.0206, 33.0207, and 33.2901 THROUGH 33.2906.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter III, Article 3, Division 2 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto new sections, to be known as and numbered 33.0206 and 33.0207, which sections shall read as follows:

"SEC. 33.0206. PRIVATE STREET PATROL SERVICE

The words "Private Street Patrol Service" as used in this Chapter shall mean any person, firm, or corporation who agrees to furnish, or furnishes, a watchman, guard, patrolman, or other person to protect persons or property or to prevent the theft, unlawful taking, loss, or embezzlement, misappropriation, or concealment of any goods, wares, merchandise, money, bonds, stocks, notes, documents, papers, or property of any kind; provided however, that this definition shall not apply to a person employed exclusively and regularly by one employer in connection with the affairs of such employer only and where there exists an employer-employee relationship.

"SEC. 33.0207. PRIVATE STREET PATROLMAN

The words "Private Street Patrolman" as used in this Chapter shall mean any person who performs the service of a watchman, guard, or patrolman for a "Private Street Patrol Service."

Section 2. That Chapter III, Article 3, Division 29 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto new sections to be known as and numbered

Sections 33.2901 through 33.2906, which sections shall read as follows:

"SEC. 33.2901. PRIVATE STREET PATROL SERVICE - REGULATED.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to engage in the business of conducting or maintaining any private street patrol service in The City of San Diego

(a) without having applied for a private street patrol service permit for such activity from the City of San Diego;

(b) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such application for a permit has been denied;

(c) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such permit has been suspended or revoked.

"SEC. 33.2902. SAME -EMPLOYEES REGULATED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to act as a private street patrolman for a private street patrol service in The City of San Diego

(a) without having applied for a private street patrolman permit for such activity from the City of San Diego within five (5) business days following the commencement of such activity;

(b) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such application for a permit has been denied;

(c) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such permit has been suspended or revoked.

"SEC. 33.2903. SAME - APPLICATION FOR PERMIT.

Applications for a private street patrol service or a private street patrolman permit shall be made to the Chief of Police on forms provided by the Chief of Police, which shall be in a form fixed by approved rules and regulations.

"SEC. 33.2904. SAME - INVESTIGATION.

The Chief of Police shall investigate the character and qualifications of all applicants. After he is satisfied that the applicant is of good moral character and qualified to hold the permit applied for, he shall issue the permit, otherwise he shall deny the application and notify the applicant of such denial by notice mailed to said applicant at the address given in his application.

"SEC. 33.2905. SAME - DURATION OF PERMIT.

All permits shall be for a term of one year from the date of issuance, and shall be in the form fixed by approved rules and regulations. The permit for private street patrolman shall set forth the private street patrol service for which the private street patrolman is authorized to act.

"SEC. 33.2906. SAME - RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The Chief of Police may adopt Rules and Regulations, subject to the approval by resolution of the City Council, to:

(a) Fix the manner in which private street patrol service shall register the private street patrolmen acting for them, and the persons whom they serve.

(b) Designate the insignia to be worn by private street patrolmen and limit its use.

(c) Prohibit the use of private street patrolmen uniform resembling official peace officers' uniforms.

(d) Prohibit the use of markings or insignia on private street patrol motor vehicles that resemble markings or insignia on official police motor vehicles.

(e) Designate the arms and equipment that a private street patrolman may carry.


(f) Otherwise regulate the conduct of private street

patrol service and private street patrolmen so as to effectuate the general purpose of this ordinance.

A violation of approved rules and regulations by a permittee shall be grounds for suspension of said permit.

"SEC. 33.0206. PRIVATE STREET PATROL SERVICE

The words "Private Street Patrol Service" as used in this Chapter shall mean any person, firm, or corporation who agrees to furnish, or furnishes, a watchman, guard, patrolman, or other person to protect persons or property or to prevent the theft, unlawful taking, loss, or embezzlement, misappropriation, or concealment of any goods, wares, merchandise, money, bonds, stocks, notes, documents, papers, or property of any kind; provided however, that this definition shall not apply to a person employed exclusively and regularly by one employer in connection with the affairs of such employer only and where there exists an employer-employee relationship.

"SEC. 33.0207. PRIVATE STREET PATROLMAN

The words "Private Street Patrolman" as used in this Chapter shall mean any person who performs the service of a watchman, guard, or patrolman for a "Private Street Patrol Service."

"SEC. 33.2901. PRIVATE STREET PATROL SERVICE - REGULATED.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to engage in the business of conducting or maintaining any private street patrol service in The City of San Diego

(a) without having applied for a private street patrol service permit for such activity from the City of San Diego;

(b) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such application for a permit has been denied;

(c) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such permit has been suspended or revoked.

"SEC. 33.2902. SAME-EMPLOYEES REGULATED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to act as a private street patrolman for a private street patrol service in The City of San Diego

(a) without having applied for a private street patrolman permit for such activity from the City of San Diego within five (5) business days following the commencement of such activity;

(b) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such application for a permit has been denied;

(c) or having received notice from the City of San Diego that such permit has been suspended or revoked.

"SEC. 33.2903. SAME-APPLICATION FOR PERMIT.

Applications for a private street patrol service or a private street patrolman permit shall be made to the Chief of Police on forms provided by the Chief of Police, which shall be in a form fixed by approved rules and regulations.

"SEC. 33.2904. SAME - INVESTIGATION.

The Chief of Police shall investigate the character and qualifications of all applicants. After he is satisfied that the applicant is of good moral character and qualified to hold the permit applied for, he shall issue the permit, otherwise he shall deny the application and notify the applicant of such denial by notice mailed to said applicant at the address given in his application.

"SEC. 33.2905. SAME - DURATION OF PERMIT.

All permits shall be for a term of one year from the date of issuance, and shall be in the form fixed by approved rules and regulations. The permit for private street patrolman shall set forth the private street patrol service for which the private street patrolman is authorized to act.

"SEC. 33.2906. SAME-RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In an R-1 Zone no building or premises shall be erected, constructed, converted, established, altered and/or enlarged or used except for one or more of the following uses:

(1) Single family dwelling; provided however, that not more than two (2) persons in addition to members of the family may be boarded or lodged therein; and further provided that all boarders and/or lodgers shall be housed within the single family dwelling and not in any permitted accessory building;

(2) Farms, truck gardens, including all types of agriculture and horticulture except commercial dairies, poultry, rabbit, fox, goat and hog farms;

(3) Nurseries and greenhouses used only for the propagation and cultivation of plants, provided all fertilizers, empty containers and planting materials, are stored a minimum of seventy (70) feet back of street frontage;

(4) Parks, playgrounds;

(5) Regulation golf courses;

(6) Accessory buildings and uses customarily incident to any of the above permitted uses;

In an R-1 Zone only one single family dwelling may be erected, constructed, converted, established, altered and/or enlarged or used on any one lot or parcel of land.

For the purpose of this Section, the term "lot or parcel of land" shall be deemed to mean a piece of residence property
